The Chadwick Center for Children and Families at Rady Children's Hospital- San Diego , is one of the largest hospital-based Children's Advocacy Center (CAC) and trauma treatment centers in the nation. We provide family-focused and trauma-informed services to children and adolescents who may have experienced or witnessed maltreatment, abuse or violence. Central to Chadwick CAC services, the Forensic & Supportive Services Program (FSS) provides vital services and information to children who have experienced maltreatment or witnessed violence, and their families.

The FSS Supervisor leads our diverse team of forensic interviewers, advocates, therapists, and medical team support staff in a collaborative environment, provides crisis intervention support as needed, and manages the flow of the department to make sure diverse needs of our clients are met.

The Chadwick Center is looking for a leader with experience managing a cross-collaborative team in a behavioral health setting. Previous work within a Child Advocacy Center or working with children, and experience in building relationships with community partners is preferred. The Forensic Services Supervisor position requires a commitment to fostering a working culture where the life experiences and opinions of all employees are valued and is considered to aid in meeting the diverse needs of our clients. The applicant for this position must prioritize equity, inclusivity and respect and have a commitment to performance and operational excellence.

Minimum Requirements:

- Master's degree
- 2+ years of experience supervising staff
- Strong leadership and interpersonal skills
- Experience working with a multidisciplinary team, including law enforcement and child welfare
- Experience working in a mental health clinic or other behavioral health setting

The FSS Supervisor works closely with the Medical Director, who supervises our Child Abuse Pediatrics team, along with other clinical leaders within Chadwick to ensure clients are supported in accessing the range of service available. This position plays a key role in developing collaborative relationships with strategic internal and external multidisciplinary team members and collaborating organizations at the local, state, and national level and serves as liaison with the District Attorney, HHS, County Counsel, and law enforcement.



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
