# SEEKING A PASSIONATE PREVENTION PROGRAM SUPERVISOR!



The Chadwick Center for Children and Families at Rady Children's Hospital San Diego, is one of the largest hospital-based Children's Advocacy Center (CAC) and trauma treatment centers in the nation. We provide family-focused and trauma-informed services to children and adolescents who may have experienced or witnessed maltreatment, abuse or violence. The Trauma Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI) Initiatives promote child abuse prevention and early intervention, including Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health services. These grant-funded programs deliver clinical services, professional training, and consultation to improve outcomes for children ages 0-5 and their caregivers.

The Trauma PEI Supervisor provides administrative oversight for the BrightConnections program and other prevention initiatives. This role collaborates with clinical and administrative leaders to ensure integrated, high-quality services for families.

The Chadwick Center is looking for a leader with experience in early childhood mental health who has or can develop advanced expertise in outreach, prevention, and system-level collaboration in child abuse and early childhood mental health.

The position requires a commitment to fostering a working culture where the life experiences and opinions of all employees are valued and is considered to aid in meeting the diverse needs of our clients. The applicant for this position must prioritize equity, inclusivity and respect and have a commitment to performance and operational excellence.

The Trauma PEI Supervisor reports to the Director of Clinical Operations, and works closely with other programs within the CAC to ensure clients are supported in accessing the range of service available.

## Minimum Requirements:

- Master's degree and licensure as LMFT, LCSW, LPCC, or Psychologist
- 2+ years of experience with infant and early childhood mental health
- 2+ years of experience with children and families exposed to trauma
- Experience in at least one evidence-based practice modality in early childhood mental health
